Welcome to the Durham County Show Equestrian Arenas

The 2025 show has something for everyone. With affiliated championship qualifiers and our own society classes - The Durham Festival of equine showing. All classes either affiliated or unaffiliated are open to all. Each section has an open to red circle at the top of the page making it easy to find your classes. It is the competitors sole responsibility to ensure they are suitable to enter the classes they select.

Affiliations Breed specific Qualifiers

All sections breeds and societies are affiliated with their respective governing body/society. Durham County Show has invested heavily in affiliations to insure our competitors have the chance to qualify for championships, giving our competitors more for their money & entry fees. Without affiliations our breed societies cannot continue to support the sport and the breeds they represent.

Most sections for breeds and societies have their own qualifications for championships. These will be listed here in the schedule or on the societies own website. Exhibitors are encouraged to check placing qualifications. Class eligibility is listed either in the schedule or on the specific societies websites. Most affiliated classes are open to all competitors and non society members, with eligible horses. You may need to join societies on qualifying. Competitors should always read the entry rules for all classes they enter on the societies own website.



This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 6 th – 9 th August 2025. The two highest exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.



This show is a qualifier for The Sunshine Tour Championships held at The All-England Showground, Hickstead from Thursday 11th – Sunday 14th September 2025. The Championships are for registered unaffiliated and amateur competitors in Dressage from Intro to Elementary, Show Jumping from Lead Rein to 1.0m; Showing for lead rein, inhand, ridden, working hunter, veterans, plus many more, Eventer's Challenge from 50cm through to 90cm.

Qualifying Criteria Competitor and horse must be registered with Sunshine Tour. Restrictions apply to both horse's and competitor's previous winnings and amateur status, please check the website for Terms & Conditions.

Eligible Placings: Dressage & Show Jumping: 1st – 3rd place in an unaffiliated class held 1st January to 31st July at a registered centre or club. Eventers Challenge & Showing: 1st – 4th place in an unaffiliated class held 1st November to 31st December at any centre or club, from 1st January to 31st July at a registered centre or club.

To convert an eligible placing into a qualification: Results must be submitted to Sunshine Tour for verification within one month of qualifying competition (by 4th August for all July competitions). Visit www.sunshinetour.co.uk for more information, to register and submit evidence of results.

Durham County Show Ltd require all riders whilst mounted or leading horses to wear an approved industry standard riding hat/helmet. You are required to check the standard for your discipline from the table below which was current at the time of writing. Hat standards can change and it is a condition of entry that you personally insure your hat is of correct standard for the time of use.

Suitably Mounted

All animals ridden anywhere on the showground, rings or lorry parks (day or night), must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, with a body score of 2.5 – 3 out of 5, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.

PUBLIC SAFETY

The management have taken every precaution to insure the safety of the public and exhibitors and all animale/livestock.

Management will not be held responsible for any loss or damage or injury to any persons animals or property The public MUST NOT enter any ring or animal enclosure. the public must be vigilant of vehicles and animals moving around the showground.

All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception. 2 All Affiliated Shows will offer qualification under the following rulings only: CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW QUALIFIERS (see CHAPS Handbook) CHAPS (UK) Qualifying classes enable eligible exhibits to enter the relevant classes at the CHAPS (UK) Championship Show in the year relevant to the qualification. Separate Finals will be held at the Championship Show for Yearlings, Two Year Olds, Three Year Olds and for Natives and Non-Natives (Ridden and In-hand), together with Ridden Finals for Lead Read, First Ridden, Junior, Novice and Side Saddle sections and Riding Club Finals. Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification. Those wishing to join or renew the Society will need to apply for this before 1st May each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their card in the ring at all times and have their showing card signed by the judge as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership, this MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, 29th - 31st August 2025. No qualification or membership necessary. The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus.

Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show.

Qualifying shows are open to members and non-members. In order to qualify for the HCR Championship Show at Netherton Equestrian, Perth on 6th / 7th September 2025

- HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place)
- Non-members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge if placed 1st4th(6th)), fees and register with HCR before the entries close for the HCR Championship show'

CLASS 23 HCR Ridden Ex Racehorse; horses 4 years old and over, any sex, riders 14 years and over. **CLASS 24 HCR Inhand Ex Racehorse;** horses any age and sex, handlers to be 14 years and over

Class 25 Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2025

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2025. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration.

The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final.

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 2026.

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

For qualifiers held prior to July 31st, 2025, the winner will qualify for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 23rd 2025. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on the same day.

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2024. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.







Class 90 EQUIFEST OPEN SHOW PONY FIRST RIDDEN

First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

Class 91 EQUIFEST OPEN RIDDEN SHOW PONIES

Open Show Pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cms. Any suitable sized rider.

Class 92 EQUIFEST OPEN SHOW HUNTER PONY- LEAD REIN

Show Hunter Pony Lead Rein, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Rider not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

Class 93 EQUIFEST OPEN RIDDEN SHOW HUNTER PONIES

Show Hunter Pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 153cms. Any suitable sized rider.

Class 94 EQUIFEST OPEN SMALL HUNTERS

Open Small Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age.

Class 95 EQUIFEST OPEN RIDDEN HUNTERS

Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 158cms. Riders any age.

Class 96 EQUIFEST YOUNG RIDERS (*NEW - AMENDED FROM INTERMEDIATE SRT OR SHT*)

Class 104 EQUIFEST OPEN MAXI COBS

Open Maxi Cobs, mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms – to be judged as a Cob. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any age.

Class 105 EQUIFEST OPEN RE-TRAINED RACE HORSES

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, any height. Horses must have been raced in the GB to be eligible to compete. Riders any age.

Open in Hand Piebald / Skewbald stallion, mare, colt, filly or gelding, any age. The first three places will also qualify for the BSPA Championships subject to their show rules & conditions Classes may be divided according to entries.

Class 110 EQUIFEST RIDDEN PIEBALD / SKEWBALD

Open ridden Piebald / Skewbald stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over. Riders any age. The first three places will also qualify for the BSPA Championship subject to their show rules & conditions. Spurs may not be worn by any rider on a pony (not exceeding 153cms). CLASS 112 BRHHS EVERSLEY RIDDEN HEAVY HORSES

Open to horses 4 years old and over that are registered in the main British Stud Books of the Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or Percheron Society at the time of qualification and must be entered in the name and ownership they are registered. Qualification to be awarded no lower than third place if the winning horse has already qualified. At shows where there is no Ride Judge a stand/individual show will be required. Riders will be required to give a short individual show at walk, trot & canter or set show lasting approximately 2 minutes. Change of rein and lengthened strides in trot and canter must be shown. Rein back, (optional) stand still and obedience to the leg. Horses should leave the ring at a walk or trot. Entries will not be asked to jump.



Driving Classes

Open to all - Competitors do not need to be a member of British Driving Society

Class 115 PRIVATE DRIVIng open to single or pairs

Horse or pony, 4 years old or over, driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyred vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible

Class 116 Light Trade open to single or pairs

Wording: Open to horses and ponies, 4 years old or over, singles and pairs to a traditional or traditional type trade vehicle. No goods to be carried or displayed. A small sample load may be carried on a coster turnout only.

Class 117 Exercise Carts open to any single or pairs

Open to horses & ponies, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

Class 117a Concours D'Elegance Open to singles, pairs, multiples,

4 years old or over, to a traditional type vehicle. The essence of the class is the word 'elegance' and the winner will be the turnout, which, in the opinion of the Judge, presents the most elegant effect. To include vehicle, horse, driver, passenger etc. but above all the general impression. Attention may be paid to drivers/passengers' personal costume, but fancy dress or period costume is definitely barred. The whole object of the class is to establish which turnout presents the most pleasing picture and normal judging criteria does not apply. It is judged from a distance and vehicles are NOT closely inspected. To be driven at park pace. PLEASURE DRIVING (1) Pleasure Driving classes are for newcomers to showing and not intended for those who show in private driving classes. (2) Wording: Open to horses, ponies, donkeys & mules, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a vehicle capable of seating 2 or more persons. Traditional or nontraditional vehicles are permitted, and for the purposes of this class they will be judged on equal merit. Pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres) are allowed. Lamps need not be carried. (3) Wording: To be judged on general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability. To be judged: 15% vehicle suitability, fit and cleanliness; 15% harness suitability, fit and cleanliness; 70% driver & groom, horse/pony, way of going and suitability as a family pleasure animal. Competitors may, for example be required to drive and halt between two pairs of cones and/or given other specific movements to execute in their show.

Class 117b Pleasure Driving

Pleasure Driving classes are for newcomers to showing and not intended for those who show in private driving classes. Open to horses, ponies, donkeys & mules, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a vehicle capable of seating 2 or more persons. Traditional or nontraditional vehicles are permitted, and for the purposes of this class they will be judged on equal merit. Pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres) are allowed. Lamps need not be carried. To be judged on general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability. To be judged: 15% vehicle suitability, fit and cleanliness; 15% harness suitability, fit and cleanliness; 70% driver & groom, horse/pony, way of going and suitability as a family pleasure animal. Competitors may, for example be required to drive and halt between two pairs of cones and/or given other specific movements to execute in their show

Class 118 Young Driver

Open to drivers aged 17 & under on show date driving traditional/traditional-type vehicles or an exercise vehicle fitted with traditional/traditional type wheels. Lamps need not be carried. This class is judged to determine the capabilities of the driver, and particular attention will be paid to the dress, turnout and driving procedure. A competent, experienced adult groom aged 18 years or over to be carried at all times.

RULES CONCERNING HARD HATS & YOUNG DRIVERS

a) The following are BDS rules appertaining to all Competitors.

Young Drivers - The driver must be aged 8 years or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years or over, a "responsible adult". Proof of age will be required if necessary. It is the responsibility of the owner/driver (if over 18) or (if the owner/driver is under 18) the responsible adult to ensure that his/her groom/s is/are competent for the purpose of attending to the turnout and aged 8 or over on the day of the show. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in all areas on the showground.

ii) Hard Hat Ruling - All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout.

Definition of Rescue

- 1. Any equine that is adopted, fostered, under a guardianship scheme from any National Equine Welfare Council registered Charity (NEWC).
- 2. Any equine that has been adopted, fostered, under a guardianship scheme from any other equine charity (must be registered with the Charity Commission).
- 3. Any equine that has been 'independently' rescued by an individual. There must be supporting evidence (photographic, veterinary) that will be included in the 'Rescue History' for the equine, to demonstrate their rescue status.

The two highest placed exhibits not already qualified will qualify for the Rescue Equine Society Final to be held at Equifest, Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on

Class 119 OPEN IN HAND

Open in Hand: Any age, type, breed. Mares with foal at foot are not permitted. No exhibit under the age of one year may be exhibited on its own.

Class 120 OPEN RIDDEN

Any type or breed, four years of age and over. Can include Lead Rein and First Ridden (will not be included in the initial go-round). All riders must be the appropriate height / weight for their equine.
